# New accessibility options added to the Hartford Fair!

Visitors to the Hartford Independent Fair this year will find two new accessible options to meet their needs!

Working in partnership with the Hartford Fair Board, the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities (LCBDD) will offer an accessible restroom with a universal changing table and a sensory room in the building located between the Commerce and Arts and Crafts buildings.

Both the accessible restroom and the sensory room will be available to the public from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., Aug. 4 to Aug. 8.

The accessible restroom offers a universal changing table and a Hoyer lift. Those planning to use the Hoyer lift should bring their own sling. There is also a private restroom with a toilet, sink and roll-in shower. The sensory space will offer a quiet space with low lighting and sensory-friendly seating. It may be helpful to those with autism or others who need a break from the sounds, smells and crowds of the

fair.

LCBDD received American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding to renovate a portion of the building and create the accessible restroom and sensory space.

# **Preparing for Back to School**

Going back to school after an extended break is never easy for kids or

parents. Help your child prepare for "back to school" by practicing skills such as getting ready in the morning, packing a backpack, and knowing transportation plans for getting to and from school each day. It is also helpful to practice a consistent schedule each day. This makes children feel safer and happier, which often leads to better behavior and cooperation. When they know what to expect, and what's expected of them, kids feel more comfortable and confident about what lies ahead!

# Learn more about: Autism Spectrum Disorder



Autism Spectrum Disorder (ADS) is a developmental disability that can cause social, communicational and behavioral challenges. People with ADS may behave, communicate, interact, and learn in ways that are different from others. They may also have restricted or repetitive behaviors or interests, and have different ways for learning, moving and interacting socially.

## **Unique Lending Items**

Licking County Library's unique lending items are a collection of fun and practical items, games, and equipment you can check out with your library card!

Here are a few of the lending items available!



### The Dawes Arboretum Pass

Pass admits up to six individuals (adult or child). Children under 5 receive free admission.


- Valid for one visit within 14 days of checkout.
- Valid for general admission; excludes admission to registered programs or special events.

# The Works Museum Pass

Pass admits up to four individuals (adult or child).

- Valid for one visit within seven days of checkout.
- Valid for general admission; excludes special events.
- May not be combined with any discount.
- May not be combined with another Library pass.
- Valid for SciDome admission.
- Lost passes have a \$100 replacement fee.

- Passes cannot be used for entry during the arboretum's member-only hour from 8 -9am.
- One pass per individual will be issued at a time, allowing for greater availability of passes to the community.
- Library cards do not provide complimentary entry at the gate; a Library Arboretum Pass is required for admission.

# Self-Regulation Strategies for Reducing Anxiety

Many children have fears and worries and may feel sad and hopeless from time to time. Strong fears may appear at different times during development. Children can often become very distressed about being away from their parents, even if they are safe and cared for. Practicing these strategies on a daily basis can help your child know what to do to help them reduce anxiety and stay in control when you are not present.

### To promote a calm body, try these simple activities:

- 10 wall push ups
- Press your hands together in a prayer position for 10 seconds.
- Hug yourself as tight as you can for 10-15 seconds. This can

also be done by using a stuffed animal.

- 10 toe touches
- Take a deep breath 3 times: smell the flowers, blow out the candle.

# Cooking Corner: Apple Fruit Lollipops!

### Ingredients:

- Large apples (red or green)
- Lollipop sticks
- Toothpick
- Caramel sauce
- · Dark chocolate, melted
- Semi-sweet chocolate, melted



- Crushed peanuts
- Shredded coconut flakes
- Crushed graham crackers
- Mini marshmallows

#### Instructions:


- 1. Wash and slice the apples into rounds, about 1/2 inch thick
- 2. Poke a hole on one end of the apple round with a toothpick, then insert a lollipop stick. Repeat with remaining rounds.
- 3. Dip or drizzle half of the apple round with caramel or melted chocolate. Allow to cool slightly, then sprinkle with the toppings of your choice!

# Craft Corner: Fall Sensory Table

### What you'll need:

- Plastic bin with a lid
- Corn kernels
- White rice
- Food coloring- color of your choice
- Vinegar
- Resealable plastic bag



- Felt or real leaves
- Tractor toys

### **Directions:**

- 1. Add rice to the resealable plastic bag
- 2. Add in the vinegar and food coloring of your choice
- 3. Shake the bag to distribute the color
- 4. Spread out the rice to dry
- 5. Add the corn kernels, leaves, and rice (once dry) into the plastic bin
- 6. Add in tractors or other toys of your choosing
- 7. Place the lid on the plastic container to store your sensory bin!
