## Cutting the ribbon on the E.S. Weiant Center



The E.S. Weiant Center was packed on June 20 as members of the community braved rainy weather to celebrate the ribbon cutting and re-dedication of the renovated building.

The project, which began in the summer of 2018 and wrapped up in the spring of 2019, updated the 52- year-old former school building by adding technology and creating a more efficient facility.

For the first time ever, the entire staff of the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities is now under one roof.

Newark Mayor Jeff Hall, Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities Director Jeff Davis and LCBDD Board President Dan Hoover gave remarks. Licking County Commissioner Rick Black presented the agency with a brand new Licking County flag before Mayor Hall helped Superintendent Jason Umstot cut the ribbon.
