Extension Granted for MUI Annual Reviews and Stakeholders

At the end of August 2022, we transitioned our Major Unusual Incident data to a new application called the Ohio Incident Tracking and Monitoring System (OITMS). One of the exciting changes about the system is that reports will be available in the application as opposed to being accessed through the data warehouse. While the data warehouse is still available for use, it does not include MUI data past August 31, 2022, when we launched the new system. Reports utilized by providers and county boards are not yet available in OITMS but will be soon. The MUI Registry Unit and IT partners are working diligently to resolve these issues and will let you know through Memo Monday when these reports will be available.

Due to the lack of availability of reports, DODD is granting an extension to providers and county boards in order to complete their annual MUI reviews.

- Independent and agency providers will be required to complete the annual review **by April 1, 2023**, (previously January 31, 2023) and send to the county board by April 28, 2023 (instead of February 28, 2023).

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Bureau of Worker's Comp. grants- now covering Lifting Devices, Electric Beds, Bathing Systems All Eligible for Safety Grants

The Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) reopened their [Safety Intervention Grant \(SIG\) program](#) to assist Ohio employers in purchasing equipment to protect employees from workplace injuries. The program provides 3-to-1 matching funds up to \$40,000 to private and public employers covered by the State Insurance Fund who want to purchase equipment to reduce or to eliminate injuries and illnesses associated with a particular task or operation. The new SIG program does not have those restrictions for patient lifts, powered beds, and other items. For every dollar spent on approved equipment, BWC will provide \$3, up to \$40,000 per application.

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
